Church Planting Commission

he Church Planting Commission leadership team is excited about what the Lord has in store for the next decade of church planting. We believe that through this God-inspired vision, we will see a growing revival and the birth of thousands of great churches that make Christ's name known. Let's rally together and change the world for Christ.

In collaboration with MM33, the Church Planting Commission has been implementing its Strategic Adaptive Plan. This vision consists of five initiatives that aim to help support and grow church planting activity across the national Fellowships through 2033 and beyond. Over the past year, there have been exciting developments that will be launched at the World Assemblies of God Congress in Madrid, Spain, this October 2023.

The Commission has begun the development of a Church Planting White Paper, which aims to synthesize the denomination's historical and theological foundations of church planting, including historical perspectives and modern contexts. The Research Initiative has also been instrumental in gathering data to determine the baseline number of churches globally. Simultaneously, the Platform Initiative has collaborated with the Coalition of the Willing (COTW) to provide a secure platform (iShare) to track the location and number of churches in each region.

As we look forward to this exciting season of growth and multiplication, we celebrate the incredible work God is already doing across regions. CEPI, Latin America's Church Planting Strategic Commission, focuses on raising and training church planters within the region. Over the last year, they successfully trained 1,000 new church planters, and their target for 2023 is to train an additional 1,200. Additionally, in Europe, representatives from 23 European nations gathered in Madrid for the MM33 Leader Summit, aiming to foster collaboration and develop strategies around church planting within their respective countries. Eighteen European countries have set numerical goals to grow by 7,196 churches collectively over the next ten years. In Africa, the MM33 expression, titled the Revival Fire Commission, aims to contribute 300,000 churches to the MM33 vision by 2033. Over the next ten years, the Church Planting Commission has committed to assist in sponsoring regional church planting conferences throughout Africa each year.

Missions Commission

Missions Commission Best Practices

For many years, the WAGF Missions Commission had four core purposes. They are:

- Encourage every member of the WAGF to have a Mission Sending Structure.
- Encourage focus on Unreached, Unengaged People.
- Build a foundation of Intercession.
- Encourage and facilitate collaboration and networking protocols between all members of the WAGF and Networking with missional people of like mind and heart.

In 2018, they committed to a fifth core purpose:

• Encourage "best practices," rooted in core missiological principles both as a reinforcement for traditional senders and a guide for new emerging senders.

In 2019, we named a task force, which met in January 2020 in London (right before the outbreak of Covid), to work on 15 different themes. Out of that meeting, two new task forces were named, and the work was divided into three areas:

- Missions Theology Foundations
- Best Practices for the function and administration of Missions Sending structures/agencies
- Best Practices of Missions Engagement among WAGF councils and churches

These task forces met in June and July 2022. The final work of these groups was sent out last year. We also organized

sections of the 6th World Missions Congress in Colombia (September 2022) and the 1st "Sender's Summit" in Minnesota, on May 31, 2023, around these three focuses. We are grateful for the three parts to be translated into Spanish and Portuguese, with a French version being worked on. As well, the three parts are packaged in an attractive book format, which is available as a PDF on the WAGF website (https://worldagfellowship.org/Missions/Best-Practices). I will also bring copies with me to Spain in October.

AGWM's New Leader

On August 2, The General Council of the Assemblies of God (USA) elected John L. Easter as AGWM executive director, replacing Greg Mundis, who is retiring. AGWM has about one-third of the world missionaries of WAGF churches. Because of their impact for over 100 years, they play a huge role in world evangelism. Let us pray for John as he begins his tenure on October 1. Many of you will get a chance to meet him at future events.

Spain, Kenya, and Minnesota

I look forward to seeing you in Spain soon. The Missions Commission will have a roundtable of several world leaders.

The 7th World Missions Congress will be held in Nairobi, Kenya, October 8-10, 2024.

The 2nd "Sender's Summit" will be held September 22-26, 2025, in Alexandria, Minnesota, USA.



Theological Commission— Strength Needed to Live in the Present Age

Some time ago, the Holy Spirit put this thought in my heart: "Jesus' going back to the Father was relational; Jesus' current absence is relational; and Jesus' return for His church will also be relational."

Before He was arrested and crucified, Jesus sat with His disciples and, in a very intimate way, revealed to them what His departure to the Father meant for Him and His disciples. He transparently revealed His feelings, ultimate love for them, and sadness over the act of the one who would betray Him. (John 13-17)

After His resurrection, Jesus spent 40 days with His disciples, revealing to them the principles of the Kingdom of God. (Acts 1)

His return will be as relational as His departure. Paul said that at His return, we will be in His company again, but this time we "will be with the Lord forever." (1 Thessalonians 4:17) Jesus used the parable of the ten virgins to explain the nature of His coming. He presented this event in the context and imagery of the Jewish marriage custom—one of the most relational events in the culture of that nation. (Matthew 25:1-13)

But what about His current absence? Jesus took care of this as well. He said that He will not leave us alone like orphans. (John 14:18) Jesus did not intend for us to be relation-less while He is with the Father.

"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth." (John 14:16-17)

The Holy Spirit is as relational as Jesus. "But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come." (John 16:13)

Out of this relational aspect springs all the teachings in the Epistles concerning the person and work of the Holy Spirit in us. Let's list three of them containing this relational truth:

- "And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption." (Ephesians 4:30)
- "Do not quench the Spirit." (1 Thessalonians 5:19)
- "Be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit." (Ephesians 5:18-19)

We do not live our Christian lives in a relational vacuum. The Spirit and the bride are together until the end of the Book of Revelation. They both speak the same language and have the same cry toward Jesus. John says, "The Spirit and the bride say, 'Come!'" (Revelation 22:17).

The church that is tightly connected to the Spirit of God is the church that overcomes the world! This relationship provides the strength that we need today.



MM33—Ready or Not, It's Happening!

The prophecy that you believe in will come to pass. I am not referring to a "name it, claim it" theology. But here is a truth: When a prophetic word comes from the Lord, and His people lay hold of it by stepping out in faith and action, we then see this word come to pass.

Isaiah 55:11 reminds us that the Word of the Lord "...will not return to [Him] empty, but will accomplish what [He] desires and achieves the purpose for which [He] sent it."

It's exciting to hear about the General Councils from different nations committing to plant their 100, 200, and 500 new churches. Some even say they will be doubling the number of churches by 2033.

Rev Hanook, who leads a church in Pakistan, heard about MM33. He said, "I am moving forward with this vision to plant 100 churches in Pakistan and also wherever God open doors to extend His kingdom." In May this year, he successfully established their first international church in Dubai—UAE.

Australia set a goal to plant 500 churches, and by the six-month mark, they had planted 34 churches. While we rejoice with the churches that have been planted, we also rejoice with the seed of faith that some are stepping out in. In Brunei, with a vision to plant 10 churches, 10 families have come forward to sponsor the church planting initiatives. Since then, they have seen three families joining the church plant.

Every church counts and every family counts. It is beautiful seeing how households are laying hold of the MM33 vision and doing their part to see the fruition of God's Word—1 million churches by 2033.

The Europe and Asia Pacific regions conducted their second MM33 summit. Many more nations came to hear about MM33 and indicated

their commitment to plant churches and see revival in their nations. The two regions exchanged ideas and gave out tokens of reminders to participants on sowing their Seed Story. This collaboration shows that together as the World AG Fellowship, we can do more together—so God's prophetic word will not return to Him void.

This October, MM33 will officially launch. What does this mean for us? It is the starting flag from the Spirit of the Lord for us to take His Word and run with it. With greater partnerships and sharing of strategies, I believe we will see an acceleration of growth and salvations happening across the nations. Get ready. It is happening very soon.
